## Lay Economic Development Breakfast Donald Russell, Reporting

The LEDC'S Breakfast and mini worship service was the first agenda item for Wednesday, June 22, 2011. The service set the tone for the remainder of the day. The Call to Commitment was extended by Evelyn Odom, South Conference. Jennifer Lawson, Florida Conference, gave a soul stirring rendition of "He Touched Me." Breakfast was served soon thereafter.

Retired Presiding Elder, Ralph Larry Wilson, read from Matthew 25: 14-30; subject: A Stumbling Block or Stepping Stone. Elder Wilson referenced the Connectional Lay Economic Development Corporation's statement of purpose, analogizing the statement to our Founder Richard Allen and his economic empowerment principles. He then referenced three points that he believed were of significance to the LEDC.

1. The start of the Florida Conference Credit Union, where some bad or not so pleasant setbacks were had before establishment of the good;

2. EEDLO-LEDC the concept was to have the clergy support the effort, and thus, build membership as the pastors would be in support of the CU; however, the plane never left the gate; and

3. A lack of trust of black owned businesses; thus, black enterprises suffer greatly at the hands of our people. We need to trust each other more.

## Opening Business Session & Town Hall Meeting

The second day of the 67th Convention began with Bible Study, followed by the second town hall meeting. Bishop Young entertained a plethora of questions and statements from the delegation.

The questions covered the gamut from local church trustee elections to pastors not being properly equipped to handle the concerns of their congregants. Also included were questions pertaining to funding our colleges and universities. Bishop Young again informed the delegation of major political accomplishments in the Jacksonville/Duval County area with the election of the first African American Mayor.

He also informed this 67th Convention that the former Sheriff, Nate Glover, now President of Edward Waters College, was also an EWC alumni.

Bishop Young also challenged the delegation to become more diligent in service to God and their church. He reminded the assembly that we all should take a step back and recall the time when we met the Lord. He further reminded us that we all could appreciate renewed commitment and willingness to serve both God and the church.
