The Reverend Marva T. Tisdale Mitchell was born in Jacksonville, Florida, to William Henry Taylor, Sr., and Elva Vernell Taylor. She attended Douglas Anderson Junior- Senior High School (Duval County) from first through twelfth grade and graduated in 1965. She graduated from Edward Waters College in 1969 with a B.S. degree in Business Education.

Before entering the ministry, Mrs. Marva Tisdale Mitchell had a career with the State of Florida from 1969 -2004 as a Social Worker, Quality Control Specialist, Food Stamp Supervisor, Program Specialist and Trainer in Welfare Transition/Food Stamps and Project Independence Programs. She worked briefly as a Realtor with Gloster & Associates.

Serving God's people in both secular and church led Mrs. Tisdale Mitchell to serve as Mt. Zion's YPD Director, East Florida Conference Area Director for YPD

and Women's Missionary Society Area Chairperson. In 1976, she was elected first youth Lay delegate to the General Conference in 1976 held in Atlanta, Ga. At the age of 5, Marva became a church usher and at age 11, served as a musician for Mt. Zion African Methodist Episcopal (AME), South Jacksonville Sunday School and Church.

In 1991, while working for the State of Florida, Reverend Tisdale Mitchell accepted the call to Ministry while serving as one of the musicians at Wayman Chapel AME Church under the Pastorate of the Rev. 

Bishop Rudolph Waldo McKissick, Sr.

Bishop Rudolph McKissick, Sr., is the Founder, Chairman and CEO of Mindful Meditation Ministries, Inc., in Jacksonville, Florida. This ministry teaches applicable tools, practices and biblical principles, to gain greater clarity, deeper connections and understanding, while creating a stronger prayer practice that renews spirit, mind, and faith journey. This ministry conducts Silent Retreat Experiences for Pastors and Lay Persons for a spiritually, mentally and physically restorative experience.

Bishop McKissick, Sr. serves as Pastor Emeritus of Bethel Baptist Institutional Church, located in Jacksonville, Florida. On January 31, 2014, Bishop McKissick,

Sr., retired after 48 years as the Senior Pastor. However, he now serves as Pastoral Counselor and serves at his leisure.

Bishop McKissick, Sr., is the longest serving Pastor in the church's history. He was raised from a child in Bethel, served in the Choir, Male Chorus Choir Director, Assistant Church Clerk, Church School Teacher, Assistant Deacon and Deacon, before the Lord called him to Pastor his beloved Bethel. He believes the measure of his success in ministry is accredited to his love for people and his hands-on ministry style. His longevity in ministry is attributed not to anything he's accomplished, but to those he has served and continues to serve.

During Bishop McKissick, Sr.'s tenure as pastor, an Educational Building was erected which now bears the name of "Rudolph W. McKissick, Sr." A city block of property was also purchased which currently houses the Main Sanctuary and Family Life Center. The Jacksonville City Council recognized his many noteworthy accomplishments and renamed a portion of Hogan Street as Rudolph McKissick, Sr. Boulevard in his honor.

A passionate scholar and lifelong learner, Bishop McKissick, Sr. earned a Bachelor's Degree from Edward Waters College and received Honorary Doctoral Degrees from Bethune Cookman University and Edward Waters University. He has also received advanced training at Tuskegee Institute, the Music Institute of Columbia University, Princeton University and Luther Rice Seminary.

Throughout the years, he has served in a variety of civic capacities some of which are the first Board of Trustees at the University of North Florida, the Jacksonville Urban League, and served on the Board of Trustees of Edward Waters College (University) for thirty years. He also served on the Board of the Duval Medical Center, National Council of Christians and Jews and The YMCA James Weldon Johnson Branch. He is the former president of the Baptist Ministers Conference of Jacksonville, and Former President of the Pastor's Conference of the National Baptist Convention and founder of the Christian Mission Center which later became the Help Center where persons could seek counseling and housing assistance for drug/alcoholic addiction. Bishop McKissick, Sr., was also the recipient of the Bernard V. Gregory Servant Leader Award presented by Volunteer Jacksonville in 2003. He is the organizer of the Jacksonville Coalition of African American Pastors and holds membership in a number of organizations including Life Membership in the NAACP, and Omega Psi Phi Fraternity. Bishop McKissick, Sr., also served as Bishop of Marriage and Family in the Full Gospel Baptist Church Fellowship. In February 2014 he was the Mayor's Trailblazer Honoree recipient for the Inaugural Lifetime Achievement Award.

Bishop McKissick, Sr. has traveled to South Africa with Fresh Ministries, Inc., participated in a tour of Turkey as a guest of the Amity Turkish Cultural Center and joined by other diverse members of the clergy, visiting historic cities and sites. He has conducted revivals in Panama, and toured the Holy Land twice.

Bishop McKissick, Sr. has impacted the lives of many as a positive role model all across this nation. His spirituality and sincerity are evidenced in his work as Pastor for 48 years and in serving the community. God has used his leadership as an instrument in the calling of more than fifty young men and women to the ministry which proudly includes his own son, Bishop Rudolph W. McKissick, Jr., who now serves as the Senior Pastor of Bethel.

In addition to the more than 40 ministries initiated by Bishop McKissick, Sr., he and his wife, Estelle established the (BEST) Bethel Enhancing Students Totally Saturday Academy, Inc., which is in its 26th year of existence and has earned a stellar reputation across the city of Jacksonville. Along with this program, he was instrumental in Bethel's approval as a summer school site for Duval County's most academically challenged students. He and his wife established a viable Marriage Ministry which has been in existence for over thirty-five years.

Bishop McKissick, Sr., sees his greatest accomplishment after 48 years of Pastoring, is the people – not the buildings. "It is a blessing to see those you've mentored play integral parts in ministry at the church and across the nation," Being a people's person, you learn how to treat people, love people and care for people, and that gives you a Shepherd's heart." His perpetual journey has crafted a lifetime filled with respect and adoration across the nation, as well as, unimaginable blessings and irreplaceable experiences. He is comfortable in his salvation and confident in a risen Savior, absolute, with no equivocations.

On January 31, 2014 Bishop McKissick, Sr. was elevated to a special status and received an honor not many Pastors experience, in that of "Pastor Emeritus." His obedient spirit and total reliance on the Holy Spirit have afforded him the opportunity to continue to preach, teach and minister the Word of God for over 50 years which is a testament to serve as long as God grants life.

Bishop McKissick, Sr. is married to the former Estelle Teresa Lee Williams, a noted retired school administrator, for 61 years. He is the father of one son, Bishop Rudolph W. McKissick, Jr. (Kimberly) and the grandfather of three: Jocelyn, Janai and Joshua (The Trinity).

ORDINATION PREACHER

Bishop Carolyn Tyler Guidry 122nd Elected and Consecrated Bishop of the A.M.E. Church (Retired)



Long before the Right Reverend Carolyn Tyler Guidry became the122nd Elected and Consecrated Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal (A.M.E.) Church, she seemed destined for a life of commitment and significance to her church and her community. She was born and raised in Jackson, Mississippi, and came of age in the early years of the Civil Rights Movement.

Bishop Tyler Guidry worked to coordinate Freedom Rider activities between the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) in Jackson, Mississippi. She engaged in this work while raising two of the eventual six children she would have with her husband of 35 years, the late Cary B. Tyler.

After the family's relocation to Los Angeles, California, in 1964, Carolyn Tyler Guidry answered her call to preach in 1973, preaching her first sermon on the first Sunday in May at Second A.M.E. Church under the pastoral leadership of Rev. C.D. Tolliver. She was ordained itinerant deacon in 1975 by Bishop Harrison J. Bryant; and itinerant elder in 1977 by Bishop H. H. Brookins. Her first appointment was to First A. M. E. Church in Indio, California, in 1977.

In 1983 she was assigned to Cain Memorial A. M. E. Church in Bakersfield, California.

In 1989, Rev. Carolyn Tyler was assigned to the 600-member Walker Temple A. M. E. Church in Los Angeles, California. This assignment gave her the distinction of being a trailblazer again, the first woman appointed to a major metropolitan charge in the A M E Church. She was appointed the first female Presiding Elder in the Fifth Episcopal District in 1994 and served until she was elected and consecrated the 122nd A.M.E. Bishop in 2004. She was assigned as Presiding Prelate to the 16th Episcopal District (including the Caribbean, Europe, Central America, and initiated the exploration of a congregation in Lyon, France, which now has a vibrant, growing congregation.

In 2008 Bishop Tyler Guidry was assigned to the Eighth Episcopal District, comprising Mississippi and Louisiana. She led the District in acquiring an Office Building and Episcopal Residence in Jackson, MS.

She served two terms as the Chair of the Social Action Commission of the A.M.E. Church and initiated the effort for the US Postal Service to designate a stamp in honor of the founder of the A.M.E. Church, Bishop Richard Allen; that stamp was released during the first quarter of 2016. She is a lifetime member of the NAACP and an Honorary member of Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority.

A graduate of J.P. Campbell College and Tougaloo College, and Fuller Theological Seminary, she was also awarded The Doctor of Humane Letters by Payne Theological Seminary in May 2009. She was included in the archives of the HistoryMakers in November 2004. In April 2011, she was inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. International Board of Preachers at Morehouse College. The Turner Seminary awarded her The President's Lifetime Achievement Award in February 2019. She is a contributor to the fourth edition of "Those Preaching Women," by The Rev. Dr. Ella Mitchell, published by Judson Press which was released in June 2004, and has contributed to the publications of the A.M.E. Bishops, "The Anvil."

Carolyn Eujean Jackson Tyler Guidry is the mother of five sons, one daughter, thirteen grandchildren, and eleven greatgrandchildren.

Rev. Willie Barnes, Jr., Ph.D. is the senior Pastor of Saint Paul A.M.E. Church. He is an anointed preacher, teacher, motivator, and pastor, committed to delivering a relevant and contemporary message focused on faith, encouragement, and empowerment.

From an early age, Rev. Barnes discerned that his life would be rooted in ministry and service. From 2018-2021, Rev. Barnes also served as the pastor of Greater Bethel A.M.E. Church in Downtown/Overtown Miami, FL. Here, strategic partnerships were formed, structural renovations were completed, and community outreach was increased.

In November 2022, Rev. Barnes was assigned as the 36th pastor of Saint Paul A.M.E. Church, Jacksonville, FL where he hopes to continue the legacy of leadership cultivated by his predecessors. In the spring of 2022, Rev. Barnes graduated from the University of Central Florida with a Ph.D. in sociology. His dissertation was entitled "Multiracial but not Post Racial: The Reproduction of Racial Ideology and Processes in a Multi-racial Church." Rev. Barnes academic interests include race, religion, and social inequalities.

He is the proud husband to Rev. FranShon Reid-Barnes, a sixth generation A.M.E. preacher and entrepreneur and the father to Harleaux Marie Reid Barnes.

It was her distinct pleasure and privilege to serve as the Coordinator of the East Conference Women in Ministry for the past 10 years until June 30, 2023.

Her diverse portfolio includes being a non-violent civil rights organizer, applied researcher, educator, licensed register dietitian, and radio talk show host. Her commitment to community empowerment is evident through her involvement in

The extent of her community influence is demonstrated through her service as a servant leader on the Board of Directors of numerous organizations including Jacksonville Women's Network, Leadership Jacksonville, Leadership Florida Alumnus, President of the National Association of Blacks in Nutrition and Dietetics, Hubbard House, Jacksonville Community Council, Inc., American Cancer Society-Duval Unit, First Coast American Heart Association, National Congress of Political Black Women, and National Coalition of 100 Black Women.

Dr. Jackson's extensive career has focused on preventive health and social change, with a special emphasis on improving the quality of life for vulnerable populations. Her impressive academic background includes a Master of Divinity, a Doctor of Philosophy in Public Administration, a Master of Public Administration, and a Master of Science in Food Science and Human Nutrition. She is also a Licensed Registered Dietitian with certifications in various health-related fields.

The enthusiasm and caring spirit of The Reverend Dr. Helen D. Jackson in servant leadership, inspiration as a role model, and dedication to the high standards of professionalism is noteworthy.
