Marilyn Virginia Mickins Surcey was born in Jacksonville, Florida on March 29, 1920 as the first child of seven to Grant and Fannie Mickins, II. They raised Marilyn, two sisters and four brothers on 22nd Street in Jacksonville, FL. The family worshipped at Mount Ararat Baptist Church when The (Late) Reverend Dallas J. Graham was their Pastor.

Marilyn completed her early education at The Davis Street School and graduated from Stanton High School in 1938. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Education from Florida Agricultural & Mechanical College (FAMU) in Tallahassee, Florida, where she graduated in 1942.

On September 15, 1945 in Louisville, Kentucky, she married Tuskegee Airman, Lieutenant Wayman Philip Surcey (deceased February 3, 1995), who was a life-long disciple of Saint Paul A.M.E. Church. They lived in Jacksonville, Florida where they raised one daughter: Angela Joyce. Marilyn told her that name was given because she was their "Angel of Joy." She was predeceased by her parents and three brothers: Nathaniel, Warren and Alvin.

Mrs. Surcey worked as an Elementary School Teacher in the Duval County Public Schools, where she taught 4th & 5th grade at West Lewisville, 4th grade at Mary McLeod Bethune and 5th grade at Hyde Park when the school became newly integrated in 1969. After more than 30 years, she retired on September 1, 1975. Marilyn is a member of Mount Ararat Baptist Church, The Reverend David Lattimore, Jr., Pastor, where she was baptized in 1934. She served as a Missionary, worked with the youth during Vacation Bible School, and as the Sunday School pianist for many years. She was also a dedicated member of "Live Long and Like It."

In addition to her daughter: Angela Surcey Garner (Willie), she leaves behind two loving sisters, Mattie B. Henderson (CA) and Laura M. Lee; brother, Grant S. Mickens, III (CA); nieces, Sharon H. Bonner (Clarence), Cathy H. Mitchell (Harry), Beverly Dougherty (Joe), Novik M. Lee, Renee A. Surcey and Katherine M. Surcey; nephew, Dexter Henderson; grandnieces/nephews, many devoted cousins, relatives, and caring friends.


