
Who are the delegates?

### Purpose

To gain an understanding of the process in which we elect delegates to the Electoral College and General Conference.




#### What is the Electoral College?

Lay Electoral College - A body of laypersons elected from each station, circuit and mission in the Annual Conference whose purpose is to elect delegates to the General Conference, in accordance with *The Doctrine and Discipline of the African Methodist Episcopal Church*.

### What about clergy?

Qualified ministers hold an election separate from the Lay Electoral College to elect delegates to the General Conference.

#### Qualifications

#### LAY ELECTORAL COLLEGE DELEGATES

- Member in good and regular standing for at least the four years prior to General Conference
- Member of local church for six months prior to Electoral College Meeting
- Love for the church

## Electing Delegates to the Lay Electoral College

• Where?

**Local Church Conference** 

• When?

At least three months prior to the Electoral College Meeting

#### • Who?

Two delegates from each local church should be elected: One adult (18 and up), and one young adult (18–35). The young adult should be elected by the young adult members in a separate setting.

## Electing Delegates to General Conference

Ministers and Lay Electoral College delegates that aspire to become General Conference delegates must submit their intent to the Bishop's office.

The elections of General Conference delegates will occur at the Annual Conference prior to General Conference.

The ministers and the Lay Electoral College will meet in separate settings.

## Now, why do I want to be a delegate to the Lay Electoral College?

I want to attend the General Conference as an ELECTED Delegate or Alternate.

I want to help elect the delegates and alternates that will represent our conference at General Conference.
